Obvious to Whom? Evaluating Inventions from the ...

The "nonobviousness" standard determines how much an invention must differ from the prior art in order to qualify for a patent.¹ In theory, this standard prevents issuance of patents on inventions that, although new, are so close to the prior art that they are likely to be forthcoming.
